Action Students Can Take on Environmental Issues

Overview:

As part of the mutual exchange between the Six National Universities and AUN, a four-day online training will be held for students from AUN member universities and the Six National Universities. In this training, students will share ideas on actions that can be taken by students on "environmental issues," focusing on Goals 7, 11, 12, 13,14, and 15 of the SDGs. Through group work among university students from ASEAN countries and Japan with diverse backgrounds, the training will enhance crosscultural communication skills in the process of achieving the issues and provide an opportunity for multicultural understanding.

Theme:

Intercultural Exchange Online Workshop: Action Students Can Take on Environmental Issues

Objectives:

As extreme heat and abnormal weather caused by global warming have become global problems, interest in environmental issues is growing toward the realization of a sustainable society. The discussion will focus on the environmental goals of the SDGs, such as Goal 7 (energy), Goal II (urban air pollution, greenery), Goal I2 (waste, food loss, plastic problems, etc.), Goal I3 (climate change), Goal I4 (oceans), and Goal I5 (forests). This will deepen mutual understanding and empathy by recognizing differences in cultures and values among countries and respecting each other as individuals.
