I'll have bread, please. I'd like bread, please.

[chán ?aw sɛɛn-wít khâ?] (female speaker)

I'll have sandwich, please. I'd like sandwich, please.

# [phòm khòo khúk-kîi kàp náam-plàaw khráp] (female speaker)

I'll have cookies and plain water, please. I'd like cookies and plain water, please.

# [phòm ?aw khéek kàp chaa rɔ́ɔn khráp] (female speaker)

I'll have a piece of cake and hot tea, please. I'd like a piece of cake and hot tea, please.
