Polite ending particles

- [khá?] (female speaker) polite ending particle of a question
- [khâ?] (female speaker) polite ending particle of a statement or to show that one is listening
- [khráp] (male speaker) polite ending particle used when asking a question, making a statement and showing that one is listening

A question word

[ʔàʔ-raj]

what (used at the end of a question
and in this lesson the answer is a snack or drink)

Sentence patterns

[chán khǒɔ khàʔ-nǒm-paŋ khâʔ]
(female speaker)

I'll have bread, please.
I'd like bread, please.

[chán ʔaw sɛɛn-wít khâʔ]
(female speaker)

I'll have sandwich, please.
I'd like sandwich, please.

[phǒm khǒɔ khúk-kîi kàp náam-plàaw khráp]
(female speaker)

I'll have cookies and plain water, please.
I'd like cookies and plain water, please.

[phǒm ʔaw khéek kàp chaa rónn khráp]
(female speaker)

I'll have a piece of cake and hot tea, please.
I'd like a piece of cake and hot tea, please.
