Program in Brief

The PSU Thai Cultural Camp has been specially designed to allow participants from overseas learn more about Thailand, its culture, language, gastronomy, SDGs, and traditions.

- 14 days in “The Land of Smiles”
- full of Cultural Discoveries: Thai Language, cooking, boxing, music, traditional medicine, way of life, handy craft, etc.
- visits to museums and historical places
- excursions to renowned tourist places: Phuket Province
- exchange cultural experiences with PSU Thai students

Program venue

Prince of Songkla University Hat Yai Campus, Thailand, is the main PSU campus, located in the busy, commercial city of Hat Yai in Songkhla province. Hat Yai Campus, with its attractive landscape, provides a serene setting ideal for education and learning, and is the center of various disciplines, including Health Science, Science and Technology, Engineering, Management, Liberal Arts, Economics, Law, Natural Resources, and Agro-Industry.

Camp’s activities and classes are arranged on campus (except for trips and excursions), providing access to campus-wide Wi-Fi internet, many delicious students’ cafeteria, and a modern Sport Complex, inclusive of an Olympic-size swimming pool.

The city of Hat Yai is about 60 km from the Malaysian border, one hour flying from Bangkok, Kuala Lumpur, and Singapore, and 30 km from the beautiful tropical long beaches of Songkhla. It is a modern city, with a vibrant mix of Thai, Chinese, and Malay influences, making Hat Yai a thrill to visit with many cultural and modern entertainment attractions.

Classes & Workshops

Various hands-on topics on Thai language, Thai Way of Life, Gastronomy, Thai Sweets Baking, Thai Music, Thai Folk Sports, Thai Arts, Traditional Medicine, Thai Cooking, Thai Boxing, and SDGs are covered by the program.

Special Lectures

Songkhla as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy

A distinctive feature of the camp is the “**Songkhla as a UNESCO Creative City of Gastronomy**” session, where participants explore how local food heritage, culinary wisdom, and community-based gastronomy contribute to sustainable development, cultural identity, and social resilience. Through expert lectures and site visits, students will learn how gastronomy in Songkhla goes beyond cuisine, serving as a creative tool for innovation, livelihoods, and community well-being.

From Thai Kitchen to Food Innovation for Emergencies

The “**From Thai Kitchen to Food Innovation for Emergencies**” session emphasizes the role of Thai food innovation in crisis and disaster response. Led by experts from **PSU Faculty of Agro-Industry**, participants will be introduced to innovative pouch food technology developed as emergency and survival meals. This food innovation has been practically applied as relief supplies for flood victims in Hat Yai during the recent flooding incidents, demonstrating how academic research can generate real-world impact. Students will gain insights into food processing, packaging, safety, and sustainability, as well as the humanitarian role of food innovation in emergency situations.

Thailand's SDGs: from Ideas to Impact

In alignment with the global development goals, the camp further explores “**Thailand's SDGs: from Ideas to Impact**”, showcasing how Thailand localizes the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) through education, community engagement, environmental conservation, and innovation. Participants will learn how universities, local communities, and industries collaborate to translate ideas into tangible outcomes that support sustainability, resilience, and inclusive growth.

Experience, Explore, Enjoy

Participants will be able to experience a broad variety of activities introduced and guided by knowledgeable instructors. For example, during the Thai Cooking session participants will cook and taste several Thai dishes, like the authentic and traditional Thai style “Tom Yam Kung.” Also, during the Thai Traditional Medicine class, Thai Herbs and Spa are introduced and participants will learn how to do themselves herbal medicines. They will take all knowledge back home, to apply it in their own country.

Field Trips

Participants have the opportunity to travel to and get first-hand information on historical places and renowned tourist attractions in Southern Thailand, such as:

- **Songkhla:** Samila Beach, Folklore Museum, Old Town, etc.
- **Phuket:** Tour & Snorkeling around white-sand islands, tropical beach, etc.

By combining the cultural heritage, food innovation, and sustainable development, the **PSU Thai Cultural Camp** offers to participants a unique learning journey—linking **Thai traditions with modern innovation, and local wisdom with global responsibility**. Students will not only experience Thai culture, but also gain valuable perspectives on how culture, science, and sustainability intersect to address real-world challenges.

Accommodation & Facilities

Students will be accommodated in a nice and comfortable hotel. Laundry service, restaurants, and mini-marts are available nearby.

PSU provides campus-wide Wi-Fi internet, and many delicious and inexpensive food courts, a student activity building, and a modern Sport Complex with an Olympic-size swimming pool.

- The minimum age of the participant must be 18.
- Participant's passport must be available for minimum six (6) months from the date of entering Thailand.
- Participants from PSU partner universities benefit of discounts only if they are nominated by their university via the specific Application Form received from PSU.
